In 1895, it was the dream of Harriett Mulford Lothrop, the Regent of the Old Concord Chapter, NSDAR that a Children's Society be formed. Mrs. Lothrop remained the first President from 1895 until 1901. During her tenure as President, Mrs. Lothrop saw the membership grow during the first year to 318 members. Today N.S.C.A.R. is proud of it over 9,000 members

Frequently Asked Questions

What are the benefits of C.A.R.?

Members and alumni responded with "Companionship with other youth who have similar interest and developing leadership skills," "FUN," and "acquiring hands-on knowledge of American History."

What are the requirements for membership?

Any boy or girl under the age of twenty-two is eligible for membership in the National Society of the Children of the American Revolution who is lineally descended from a man or woman who, with unfailing loyalty, rendered material aid to the cause of American Independence as a soldier, sailor, civil officer, or recognized patriot in one of the several Colonies or States, or of the United States, provided that the applicant is personally acceptable to the Society.

When do you age out of C.A.R.?

A member "ages out" upon his/her 22nd birthday and is no longer a member of C.A.R. He or she is then eligible to become a Senior leader at the Local, State or National level. Your C.A.R. membership number can be used with an application to join DAR or SAR. Additionally, C.A.R. Alumni members are automatically members of the C.A.R. Alumni Foundation. How do I know if my application has been approved?

Applications are approved on a rolling basis. Generally the process requires approximately 6-8 weeks from the time we receive the papers. The member will receive notification by U.S. Mail and a copy of the application papers will be sent to the Senior Society President.
